## Clinical Indication

• Screening: to determine if patient is hypo- or hyperglycemic

Diagnostic: to adjust insulin dosing for a patient with a serum glucose derangement

## Documentation

 Orders and results will be documented in the patient's electronic medical record or a downtime form,

## Clinical Action

- If result is abnormal or critical, follow appropriate procedure. Refer to reference range in the Fingerstick Glucose policy in http://www.sfgh-poct.org/glucose/
- If the blood glucose result does not reflect the patient's clinical symptoms, or seems
  unusually high or low, perform a control test. If the control test confirms that the
  system is working properly, repeat the blood glucose test. If the repeated blood glucose
  result still seems unusual, send a sample to the Clinical Laboratory for blood plasma
  glucose testing.
