- For Screening:
  - To determine if a patient is hypoglycemic or hyperglycemic.
- For Diagnostics:
  - To treat or maintain treatment of the Diabetic Patient.
  - o To assist in management of patient undergoing Steroid Therapy.

## Documentation

 Orders and results will be documented in the patient's electronic medical record or a downtime form.

## **Clinical Action**

- If result is abnormal or critical, follow appropriate procedure. Refer to reference range in the Fingerstick Glucose policy in <a href="http://www.sfgh-poct.org/glucose/">http://www.sfgh-poct.org/glucose/</a>
- If the blood glucose result does not reflect the patient's clinical symptoms, or seems
  unusually high or low, perform a control test. If the control test confirms that the
  system is working properly, repeat the blood glucose test. If the repeated blood glucose
  result still seems unusual, send a sample to the Clinical Laboratory for blood plasma
  glucose testing.
